An Act proclaiming May as Aviation Awareness Month.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 6 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is  
2 hereby amended by inserting after Section 15KKKKK, the following section:

3 Section 14LLLLL. The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the  
4 month of May as Aviation Awareness Month, to increase public awareness of the economic,  
5 transportation, medical, public safety and recreational benefits of general aviation to the citizens  
6 of the Commonwealth, and shall recommend that the day be observed in an appropriate manner  
7 by the people.
