The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to police and youth partnership.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 96B of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the fourth paragraph the following
3 paragraph:-

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 31 and any collective bargaining, any person
5 appointed to a position on a full-time basis in which he will exercise police powers in the police
6 department of any city or town, shall, upon his hiring and within his first 2 years of service,
7 volunteer a minimum of 10 hours per quarter, collectively 40 hours per year, to a community
8 youth organization or youth activity. The police officer shall select any community youth
9 organization or youth activity that he sees fit so long as his volunteer work affords him an
10 opportunity to build a positive relationship with youth in the community in which he serves. The
11 police officer may select multiple organizations or activities to fulfill the minimum requirements
12 of this section. Any volunteer work performed pursuant to this section shall be performed during
13 non-work hours and shall be unpaid.
