An Act creating a school resource officer grant program and fund.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
 is hereby amended by inserting the following section: -

3 Section 10. School Resource Officer Grant Program

4 (a) From the funds appropriated for such purpose and from the gifts, donations, grants, 5 bequests, and other funds received on its behalf, there is established (1) the School Resource 6 Officer Grant Program, to be administered by the board, in consultation with the Board of 7 Education, and (2) a special nonreverting fund within the state treasury known as the School 8 Resource Officer Incentive Grant Program, hereinafter known as the fund. Any monies 9 remaining in the fund at the end of the legislative session shall not revert to the General Fund, 10 but shall remain in the fund. Interest earned on such funds shall remain in the fund and be 11 credited to it.

12 Subject to the authority of the board to provide for its disbursement, the fund shall be 13 disbursed to award matching grants to local law enforcement agencies and local school boards 14 that have established a collaborative agreement to employ uniformed school resource officers, as 15 defined in subsection (b) of this section 10, in middle and high schools within the relevant 16 school division. The board may disburse annually up to five percent of the fund for training of 17 the school resource officers. School resource officers shall be certified law enforcement officers 18 and shall be employed to help ensure safety, to prevent truancy and violence in schools, and to 19 enforce school board rules and codes of student conduct.

- (b) A "school resource officer" is defined as a certified law enforcement officer hired by
 the local law enforcement agency to provide law enforcement and security services to the
 Massachusetts elementary and secondary public schools.
- 23 (c) The board, in consultation with the commissioner and the Department on Public
- 24 Safety, shall establish criteria for making grants from the fund, including procedures for
- 25 determining the amount of a grant and the required local match. Any grant or general funds shall
- 26 be matched by the locality on the basis of the locality's ability to pay. The board may adopt
- 27 guidelines governing the program and the employment and duties of the school resource officers
- as it deems necessary and appropriate.
