- SECTION 1. Section 6B of chapter 159B, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is 4 hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following:-
- For purposes of this section, when towing is ordered by the police or other public
- authority, reimbursable recovery expenses and or fees to the towing and recovery company for commercial and non-commercial tows shall include services necessary to recovery of a disabled
- 8 motor vehicle that include, but not be limited wrecker working, winching, waiting time, clean up
- 9 time and the provisions for special equipment and personnel necessary for placing disabled
- 10 vehicle in a position to be towed. The charges for such extraordinary, special or additional
- 11 services shall not exceed the carrier's normal and customary rates charged to similarly situated
- 12 customers.
