An Act relative to investment in employment programs that save our youth.

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15 16 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 23H of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after Section 11 the following:-

Section 12. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, it shall be the policy of the Commonwealth to invest in low-income, disadvantaged youth with high-impact programs that mitigate violence in inner-city neighborhoods and provide education and job skills in school that promote long-term economic success.

The Department of Workforce Development shall coordinate with qualified non-profit community development organizations of its selection on a year-round, at-risk youth employment and career exploration program. The program shall focus on providing low-income, disadvantaged youth with a jump start in building the skills, credentials and attitudes they will need to succeed in school and at work. For students in high school, emphasis shall be placed on MCAS tutoring, and for out-of-school youth, emphasis shall be placed on a GED program or other educational alternatives.

The initiative shall receive support services through a case management model which offers assessment, development of an individual service plan, information/referral services, and ongoing counseling.
