The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to recognizing cheerleading as a sport.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by adding the following section:-

3 Section 37P. It is hereby declared to be the policy of the commonwealth to encourage all
4 school committees to recognize cheerleading as an interscholastic sport and to adopt policies that
5 promote equal opportunities and funding for said sport.
