An Act relative to the self-determination advisory board.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Chapter 255 of the Acts of 2014 is hereby amended by striking out section (c) in its
entirety and inserting in place thereof the following:-

3 (c) The department shall establish a statewide self-determination advisory board to advise 4 the department on efforts to implement, publicize, evaluate, improve and develop information 5 regarding self-determination. The advisory board shall consist of: 19 individuals appointed by 6 the commissioner, 1 of whom shall be a member of the department, who shall serve as chair, 1 of 7 whom shall be a member of an advocacy organization, 1 of whom shall represent taxpayers, 1 of 8 whom shall have experience with consumer protection, 1 of whom shall have experience with 9 self-determination models, 1 of whom shall have experience with nonprofit and for-profit services markets and competition and services for persons with disabilities, 1 of whom shall have 10 experience with financial management services, 1 of whom shall be an independent facilitator; 1 11 12 of whom shall be a provider of direct services, supports or goods and 10 of whom shall be a participant or a family member, legal representative or guardian of a participant; 1 individual 13 appointed by the disabled persons protection commission; 1 individual appointed by the office of 14 the inspector general; and 1 individual appointed by the office of the state auditor. Members shall 15 16 serve for a term of 3 years. Upon the expiration of the term of any member, a successor shall be 17 appointed in like manner. The appointing entity shall in like manner fill any vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term. 18

19 The self-determination advisory board shall also compile, and continually update, a list of 20 participants or participants' chosen planning teams who are willing to volunteer to discuss their 21 experiences in self-determination with individuals considering implementing the self-

- 22 determination option in their individual support plans and shall provide said list to the
- 23 department.
