By Mr. Sciortino of Medford, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 490) of Carl M. Sciortino, Jr. and others for legislation to require the disclosure to parents of standardized student assessments from kindergarten through twelfth grade. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act requiring school districts, with the assistance of the department of elementary and secondary education, to disclose information about required assessments.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 1I of Chapter 69 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following two paragraphs at the end thereof: -

At the beginning of each school year, school districts must notify parents or guardians of enrolled students with the following information about each standardized assessment from kindergarten through twelfth grade that is required by the state or by the federal government:

- 6 (a) The subject areas covered by each assessment and what will be measured by each;
- 7 (b) When each standardized assessment will be administered;
- 8 (c) Whether each standardized test has been screened for bias;
- 9 (d) The time expected to take each standardized assessment;
- (e) Whether students will be required to take standardized assessments online, or have theoption of paper and pencil;
- (f) Which assessments will be required for graduation and what options students have to
 meet graduation requirements if they do not pass a given assessment;
- (g) How assessment results affect a student's high school and beyond plan and course taking progression leading to timely graduation, as well as whether results of standardized
 assessments will be used for program placement or grade level advancement;

(h) When the assessment results will be released to parents or guardians and whether
there will be an opportunity for parents and teachers to discuss strategic instructional
adjustments;

- 20 (i) The process, forms, and time necessary to access individual students' tests;
- 21 (j) How the assessment and assessment results will advance student learning;
- 22 (k) The amount of instructional time spent in administering the assessment;

(1) The financial cost to both the school district and Commonwealth of administering theassessment;

- (m) Whether the assessment is required by the Commonwealth, by the federalgovernment, or by both; and,
- (n) The availability of appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities and
 English language learners, with information for parents in languages other than English for nonEnglish speaking parents.
- 30 The department of elementary and secondary education shall provide to school districts 31 regularly updated information necessary for districts to notify parents of the information under 32 this section, including any changes occurring through regulatory, legislative or federal action, 33 that will affect current or future assessments; further, the department shall provide templates and 34 any other assistance necessary to notify parents on a timely basis; provided, further, the 35 department shall institute a grant program for school districts to pay any costs associated with 36 preparing, printing or distributing information to parents, as required by this section, and funding for said grant program and any other costs to the department shall come from the 37 38 funding allocated for the administration of the state assessment system.
