The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to the excise tax on malt beverages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the
2 contrary, the excise tax on Malt beverages, as described in Section 21 of Chapter 138 of the
3 General Laws (a) shall be increased to: for each barrel of 31 gallons of aforesaid malt beverages
4 at the rate of nineteen dollars and eighty cents (19.80) per barrel aforesaid.

5 SECTION 2: A special trust fund shall be established within the Commonwealth
6 where all new revenue from the excise tax increase on malt beverages shall be deposited and
7 apportioned:

8 Two dollars (2.00) per barrel of said increase shall be allocated to fund the operations of
9 Massachusetts Criminal Justice Committee, not less than eight (8) million; with the balance of
10 said increase fourteen dollars and fifty cents (14.50), to be distributed to cities and towns as local
11 aid based on amount of malt beverages sold or dispensed in said community.

12 SECTION 3: Each municipality in the Commonwealth must direct a portion of the
13 revenues gained through this legislation to be used in conjunction with youth orientated
14 education programs that focus on at conflict resolution and drug and alcohol abuse prevention.
