The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen

An Act relative to the unemployment insurance rate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding section 14 of chapter 151A of the General Laws, for
2 calendar year 2014, the experience rate of an employer qualifying therefor under subsection (b)
3 of section 14 of chapter 151A of the General Laws shall be the rate which appears in column “E”
4 of clause (1) of subsection (i) of said section 14 of said chapter 151A.

5 SECTION 2. Section 1 shall take effect as of January 1, 2014.
