The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to home health and hospice aides.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 80B of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after line 69 the following:-

Registered nurses may delegate the administration of or assistance with the administration of medications in the home to a home health aide as defined under section 72F of chapter 111 of the General Laws, provided that such an aide has completed training on medication administration according to regulations promulgated by the board of registration in

7 nursing in conjunction with the department of public health, and that the administration or

8 assistance with administration is performed under the supervision of a registered nurse.

9 The delegation of medication administration permitted under this section shall be limited 10 to medications which are oral, ophthalmic, otic, topical, internasal, transdermal, suppository, 11 prefilled, or products which are administered by inhalation. Administration of medications by 12 intramuscular, subcutaneous, intradermal, intraosseous, intravenous shall not be permitted.

13 The board of registration in nursing, in conjunction with the department of public health, 14 shall promulgate regulations pertaining to documentation protocols and training on medication 15 administration. These regulations shall specify that delegation of administration of medication

- 16 does not alter the responsibility of the home health agency or hospice to teach and the patient or
- 17 family to participate in learning the self-administration of medications, whenever appropriate.

18 Home health agencies shall provide training on medication administration to home health 19 aides and nurses and establish protocols on documenting that a home health aide or nurse has 20 completed training according to the nurse delegation model and regulations to be drafted by the 21 board of registration in nursing in conjunction with the department of public health.

These regulations shall specify that the registered nurse delegator and the home health aide are accountable for their own actions in the medication delegation process and that no registered nurse shall be required to delegate medication administration if the registered nurse determines it is inappropriate to do so.

A nurse licensed under this chapter who delegates medication administration in compliance with the rules adopted in these regulations shall not be subject to disciplinary action by the board of nursing for the performance of a person to whom medication administration is delegated.

30 SECTION 2. Section 9 of chapter 94C of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
 31 amended by inserting in the first paragraph after the words "veterinarian when registered
 32 pursuant to the provisions of chapter 7" the following:

33 "a home health aide pursuant to the provisions of subsection (8) of section 80B of chapter
34 112 of the General Laws."
