- Resolved, Resolved, That notwithstanding any General or Special Law to the contrary there is 1
- 2 hereby established a Special Commission to investigate and make recommendations to the
- General Court concerning the use of manufactured wood products and light weight wood frame 3
- 4 truss assemblies so called. Such investigation shall study the inordinate number of firefighter
- 5 deaths and injuries in this construction type, the impact these type building products will have on
- 6 fire insurance rates in the Commonwealth, whether full disclosure to home buyers detailing the
- 7 fire resistive qualities of these products compared to dimension lumber construction should be
- 8 mandated and what steps should be taken to mitigate any problems associated with these
- 9 products.

- 10 Said Committee shall comprise three members of the Senate, three members of the House of Representatives, a representative of the Executive Office of Public Safety, a representative of the Massachusetts Fire Chiefs Association, and a representative of the Professional Firefighters 12 13 of Massachusetts.
- 14 Said Committee shall report its findings to the General Court no later than January 1, 15 2014.
