## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

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In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen  
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An Act relative to tourism collaboration.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the  
2   Massachusetts Convention Center Authority shall develop and promulgate regulations to permit  
3   the placement, maintenance and operation of kiosks for promotion of tourism to regions of the  
4   Commonwealth in the Massachusetts Convention Center and the Hynes Convention Center.  
5   Said regulations shall limit the number of such kiosks to no more than one per county of the  
6   Commonwealth, and shall contain provisions including but not limited to the following:

7                   1) A process by which applications for kiosk space are received from regional  
8   tourism and hospitality organizations and analyzed, approved or rejected;

9                   2) Any relevant dimensional requirements and/or limitations on the dimensions of  
10   kiosks permitted pursuant to this section;

11                  3) Any necessary maintenance requirements for such kiosks;

12                  4) Any necessary regulations governing the appearance of such kiosks;

13                  5) A prohibition on the authority or the Commonwealth bearing any cost for the  
14   placement, maintenance, or operation of such kiosks; and

15                   6) Any relevant requirements for the staffing of such kiosks so as to comport with  
16 the operational standards of the facilities in which they are placed, provided that nothing herein  
17 shall be construed to require that individuals staffing such kiosks be compensated or be subject  
18 to a collective bargaining agreement.
