By Mr. Brownsberger, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1640) of William N. Brownsberger, Denise Provost, David M. Rogers, Jonathan Hecht and other members of the General Court for legislation to protect bicyclists in bicycle lanes. Transportation.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to protect bicyclists in bicycle lanes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1: Chapter 89 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,
2 is hereby amended by inserting the following as Section 4D:

3 The driver of a motor vehicle shall not stand or park the vehicle upon any on-street path
4 or lane designated by official signs or markings for the use of bicycles, or place the vehicle in
5 such a manner as to interfere with the safety and passage of persons operating bicycles thereon.

6 The driver of a motor vehicle shall not stand or park the vehicle upon any lane designated
7 by pavement markings for the shared use of motor vehicles and bicycles, or place the vehicle in
8 such a manner as to interfere with the safety and passage of persons operating bicycles thereon.

9 SECTION 2: Section 5 of Chapter 89 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
10 Official Edition, is hereby amended by replacing both references to “sections one to four C” with
11 “sections one to four D”, and by inserting the following sentence at the end of the first
12 paragraph:

13 In addition to the aforementioned fine, any vehicle parked in violation section 4D shall be
14 subject to immediate towing.
