### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to lawful presence.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
amended by striking, in the first paragraph, the words "proof of legal residence" and inserting in
place thereof the following:- "proof of lawful presence"; and

4 by inserting at the end of said paragraph, the following:-

5 "; provided, that proof of lawful presence shall be established only upon the presentment

6 of a valid driver's license or identification card issued in compliance with the REAL ID Act of

7 2005 (Pub. L. 109-13, 119 Stat. 302). For the purposes of this section, the presentment of a

8 utility bill, library card, lease, or other documents which may serve to prove residence shall not

9 be sufficient in establishing an applicant's lawful presence."
