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**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**  
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An Act designating a certain bridge in the city of Boston as The Brigadier General William J. Gormley III Bridge.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           The bridge on Baker Street, in the West Roxbury section of the city of Boston, shall be  
2 designated and known as The Brigadier General William J. Gormley III Bridge in honor of  
3 William J. Gormley III who served as a Commander in the Massachusetts National Guard. The  
4 Massachusetts Highway Department shall erect and maintain suitable markers bearing the  
5 designation in compliance with the standards of the department.
