By Mr. Welch, a petition (accompanied by resolve, Senate, No. 199) of James T. Welch, Angelo J. Puppolo, Jr., Karen E. Spilka and Michael R. Knapik for legislation to establish a special legislative commission on young professionals. Economic Development and Emerging Technologies.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

Resolve establishing a special legislative commission on young professionals.

1 **Resolued**, that notwithstanding any general or special laws to the contrary, there shall be 2 a special commission on young professionals established to examine how the Commonwealth 3 can better engage, involve and educate young professionals in decisions and policies that effect 4 them and the Commonwealth. The commission will examine best practices and policies to retain 5 and attract intellectual capital that will make Massachusetts a place where young professionals 6 want to live, work and play.

7 The commission shall consist of 21 members, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the 8 Governor, 1 of whom shall be the secretary of housing and economic development or a designee, 9 1 of whom shall be the secretary of labor and workforce development or a designee, 1 of whom 10 shall be the secretary of education or a designee, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the President 11 of the Senate 1 of which from the minority party, 3 of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker 12 of the House 1 of which from the minority party, 1 of whom shall be the chair of the Berkshire 13 Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Worcester Young 14 Businessmen's Association or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Greater 15 Lawrence Young Professionals Network or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the 16 Young Professionals Society of Greater Springfield or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Northampton Area Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the 17 president of ONEinThree Boston or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the Young 18 19 Professionals of Greater Lowell or a designee, 1 of whom shall be the president of the North of 20 Boston Young Professionals or a designee, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the Executive 21 Director of the New Bedford Economic Development Council, 1 of whom shall be appointed by 22 the President of the MetroWest Chamber of Commerce, 1 of whom shall be the Executive 23 Director of the Cape Cod Young Professionals or a designee.

- 24 When the commission sees fit by a majority vote they may add additional members to the 25 commission as recommended by the Governor.
- 26 The commission shall meet within 30 days of passage of this Act, and not less than
- 27 quarterly thereafter, and shall release final recommendations to Governor's Office and House
- and Senate Ways and Means Committees no later than 18 months from passage of this Act.
