By Mr. Downing, a petition (subject to Joint Rule 12) of Benjamin B. Downing, Paul W. Mark and Tricia Farley-Bouvier for legislation to establish a sick leave bank for Maria Elaskar-Stack, an employee of the Department of Children and Families. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen

An Act establishing a sick leave bank for Maria Elaskar-Stack, an employee of the Department of Children and Families.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the
2 contrary, the Department of Children and Families shall establish a sick leave bank for Maria
3 Elaskar-Stack, an employee of the department. Any employee of the department may voluntarily
4 contribute 1 or more sick, personal or vacation days to the sick leave bank for use by Maria
5 Elaskar-Stack. Whenever Maria Elaskar-Stack terminates employment with the department or
6 requests to dissolve the sick leave bank, any remaining time in the sick leave bank shall be
7 transferred to the extended illness leave bank. Sick leave bank days shall not be used for
8 absences unrelated to the illness or disability that necessitated the establishment of the sick leave
9 bank as determined by the department.
