An Act relative to the qualification of inspectors of wire and assistant inspectors of wire employed by a city or town.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 1A of Chapter 141 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official  
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new paragraphs:-

3           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, every inspectors of wires,  
4 deputy inspector of wires and assistant inspector of wires, as defined under Section 32 of Chapter  
5 166 of the General Laws, shall complete a yearly continuing education program, which shall  
6 include the review and interpretation of electrical codes and related codes, rules and regulations.

7           The state board of examiners of electricians shall promulgate rules and regulations for the  
8 implementation and requirements of continuing education for inspectors of wires.
