## In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen

An Act authorizing the licensing authority of the city of Woburn to issue additional licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Notwithstanding Section 17 of Chapter 138 of the General Laws, the
- 2 licensing authority of the City of Woburn may grant 6 licenses for the sale of all alcoholic
- 3 beverages to be drunk on the premises pursuant to section 12 of said Chapter 138. The licenses
- 4 shall be subject to all of said Chapter 138, except Section 17.
- 5 SECTION 2. The licensing authority of the City of Woburn shall restrict the licenses
- 6 granted under Sections 1 and 2 of this Act as to number and to persons, corporations,
- 7 organizations, and entities located in the following locations:
- 8 (a) Three licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises to be
- 9 available for the property located at 369 Washington Street, as more specifically shown on a plan
- which is on file with the City Clerk of the City of Woburn.
- 11 (b) Two licenses for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises to be
- 12 available for the property located at 399 Washington Street, as more specifically shown on a plan
- which is on file with the City Clerk of the City of Woburn.

(c) One license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages to be drunk on the premises to The Crestview Plaza, located at 36 Montvale Avenue in the city of Woburn, Massachusetts.

SECTION 3. A license granted under this section shall not be transferable to any other person, corporation, or organization for a period of 3 years from the date of original issuance or 3 years from the enactment of this legislation, whichever is later.

If a license granted under this section is revoked, surrendered, or no longer in use at the location of original issuance, it shall be returned physically, with all of the legal rights and privileges pertaining thereto, to the licensing authority which may then grant the license to a new applicant only at the same location under the same conditions as specified in this act provided that the applicant files a letter in writing from the department of revenue and a letter from the division of unemployment assistance indicating that the license is in good standing with those entities and that all applicable taxes, fees, and contributions have been paid.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
