## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Fourteen

An Act relative to affordable housing in the town of Shrewsbury.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Notwithstanding section 20 through 23, inclusive, of Chapter 40B of the General Laws and any regulations promulgated thereunder, any manufactured home as defined in section 32Q of chapter 140 of the General Laws, or any other dwelling unit built on a chassis and containing complete electrical, plumbing and sanitary facilities, and designed to be installed on a temporary or permanent living quarters, having been situated continuously on the same parcel in the Town of Shrewsbury for twenty years or more as of January 1, 2013, and having been assessed as a mobile or manufactured home by the Shrewsbury Board of Assessors, shall be considered "low or moderate income housing," as defined in section 20 of chapter 40B of the General Laws.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
