An Act relative to the parental notification for minors who violate probation.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 55 of chapter 119 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out the third paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following  
3 paragraph:-

4           A summons required by this and said section 54, unless service thereof is waived in  
5 writing, shall be served by a constable or police officer, by delivering it personally to at least 1 of  
6 the child’s parents, if either of them is known to reside within the commonwealth, and, if there is  
7 no such parent, then to the child’s lawful guardian, if there is 1 known to be so resident, and if  
8 not, then to the person with whom such child resides, if known, until the child reaches the age of  
9 majority, or by leaving it with a person aged 18 or older to receive the same, at the place of  
10 residence or business of such person; and said constable or officer shall immediately make return  
11 to the court of the time and manner of the service.
