An Act relative to the rights of children adopted by unmarried persons.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 210 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after Section 6E, the following section:-

3           Section 6F. After an adjudication of adoption, in the event that the adoptive parents are  
4 not married to each other, in any dispute as may arise as to custody, visitation, support,  
5 education, maintenance and health insurance, the adoptive parent may seek relief under sections  
6 nine, ten, eleven, eighteen, nineteen and twenty of chapter two hundred and nine C provided  
7 however that the provisions of paragraph B of section 10 of chapter two hundred and nine C  
8 shall not apply to this section.
