The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to vacated foreclosed residential property.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority
of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1: Notwithstanding any general or special law or rule or regulation to the
2 contrary, a creditor shall place residential properties back on the market for sale or lease within
3 one calendar year of foreclosure. Failure to place such residential properties back on the market
4 for sale or lease within one calendar year of foreclosure shall result in forfeiture of property to
5 the town or city in which the residential property is located.
