An Act prohibiting the possession by or sale of spray paint to minors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 266 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2010 Official Edition  
2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 126B the following 2 new sections:-

3           Section 126C. Whoever, being under the age of 17, possesses any aerosol canister  
4 containing paint, with the intent to violate section 126A or 126B, shall be punished by  
5 imprisonment in the house of correction for not more than 2 years or by a fine of not more than  
6 \$250, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

7           Section 126D. Whoever sells an aerosol canister containing paint to any person under the  
8 age of 17 shall be punished by a fine of \$500 for each violation of this section.
