Resolve relative to reimbursement of Colonel William J. Gormley, III.

1           **Resolved**, That for the purpose of discharging a moral obligation of the commonwealth,  
2   and after an appropriation has been made thereof, there shall be allowed and paid out of the state  
3   treasury to Colonel William J. Gormley, III, Massachusetts National Guard, the sum of  
4   \$44,983.12 for legal expenses incurred by him in defending himself against a civil complaint  
5   initiated by former Adjunct General Raymond A. Vezina. Said civil complaint having been  
6   subsequently withdrawn after evidence demonstrated that Colonel Gormley acted properly and in  
7   good faith in executing his duties and responsibilities as a member of the Massachusetts Militia.
