By Ms. Creem, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 904) of Cynthia S. Creem, Marc R. Pacheco and Ruth B. Balsler for legislation relative to acceptable health service training for psychologists. Mental Health and Substance Abuse.

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act relative to acceptable health service training for psychologists.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 118 of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the definition, “health service training
3 program” and inserting in place thereof the following definition:-

4 “Health service training program”, supervised experience at a site where health services
5 in psychology are normally provided or where licensed psychologists typically practice in a
6 recognized specialty of professional psychology by providing health services and which is part
7 of an organized integrated training program as defined by the rules and regulations of the board.
8 A school setting qualifies as a site where licensed psychologists typically practice in a
9 recognized specialty of professional psychology provided that the job description of the
10 supervising licensed psychologist includes “health service”, as defined in this section.

11 SECTION 2. Said section of chapter 112 is hereby further amended by inserting after the
12 word “provided,” in line 27 the following words:- or where licensed psychologists typically
13 practice in a recognized specialty of professional psychology by providing health services.

14 SECTION 3. Chapter 112 is hereby further amended in section 120, by adding in line 10
15 after the words “independently provides,” the following:- health services in a recognized
16 specialty,
