An Act relative to behavioral health services.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 118E of the general laws is amended by inserting after Section 9F  
2   the following section:-

3           Section 9G. The MassHealth program and its contracted managed care organizations and  
4   behavioral health subcontractors, as applicable, shall pay for services rendered by participating  
5   acute care hospitals to so called boarder patients at no less than 95% of a Medicare inpatient stay.  
6   MassHealth shall cause each Medicaid Managed Care organization contracting with MassHealth  
7   to adopt such payment policy consistent with this Act. MassHealth shall develop and submit a  
8   report regarding such payments by provider to the committee on health care finance not later  
9   than twelve months after the passage of this act and shall further submit recommendations for  
10   improving coordinated care and placement of such patients. For the purposes of this section, a  
11   boarder patient is defined as a patient being held in a hospital emergency department for at least  
12   two (2) hours after a physician has made the decision to admit or transfer the patient.
