**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act establishing a grants program to increase dental services to Medicaid eligible patients.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding at law to the contrary, the Massachusetts an appropriation  
2 of not less than \$750,000 to be awarded as grants on a competitive basis, with not more than  
3 \$250,000 appropriated in any one service area, to fund the costs associated with establishing  
4 provider services to non-profit dental providers who can document that over 50% of their  
5 patients served are Mass Health or Medicaid eligible. These grants may be renewable given  
6 certain service goals as established by the Massachusetts Department of Public Health.
