## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to in-state tuition retention for UMMS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 75 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 1A the
- 2 following:
- 3 Section 1B: Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the University of
- 4 Massachusetts Medical School shall retain all in-state tuition and mandatory general attendance
- 5 fees charged to students, provided that general attendance fees shall not include charges for
- 6 health insurance.
