### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to address the need for additional resources for the development of affordable housing for low-income seniors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of section 3 of chapter 121D of the General Laws, as
- 2 appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 15-16, the
- 3 words "to senior citizens and"
- 4 SECTION 2. Subsection (a) of section (3) of chapter 121D, as so appearing, is hereby
- 5 further amended by inserting after clause 8 the following clause:-
- 6 (9) Development of affordable housing for households with one or more persons over the
- 7 age of sixty two and having household incomes under 80% of the Metropolitan Area Median
- 8 Income as determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The fund
- 9 shall expend for this purpose not less than 10% of annual expenditures from the fund or \$6
- million per year, whichever is greater.
