By Mr. Jones of North Reading, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1120) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr., and others for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to low and moderate income housing qualifications and recertification. Housing.

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In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act establishing an Affordable Housing Qualification Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary there is hereby 2 established a special commission and study on low and moderate income housing qualifications 3 and recertification, which shall investigate and document the levels and impacts of recertification 4 management and practices within local housing authorities, and develop a strategy and 5 recommendations to reduce, minimize or eliminate recertification fraud. The commission shall 6 review the policies that underlay existing publicly financed and funded housing development 7 programs and practices of low income and moderate income housing recertification in the 8 commonwealth. 9 The commission shall consist of the secretary of housing and economic development or a 10 designee, 1 members of the house of representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of

11 representatives; 1 members of the senate appointed by the senate president; 1 member of the

12 house of representatives appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives; 1

13	member of the senate appointed by the senate minority leader; 2 members appointed by the	
14	governor; 1 of whom shall be a commissioner of a local housing authority and 1 of whom shal	
15	be an individual with expertise in low income and moderate income housing.	
16	The executive office of housing and economic development and its subdivisions shall	
17	provide technical support to the commission.	
18	The commission shall file its report, together with recommendations for changes to	
19	improve recertification management with clerks of the house and senate, the house and senate	
20	chairs of the joint committee on housing and the joint chairs, and the house and senate chairs of	
21	the joint committee on municipalities and regional government.
