The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to regulate homeowners' associations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 59 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 76 the following section:-
- 3 Section 76A. If a parcel of real property is developed pursuant to a subdivision plan
- 4 approved by a city or town and has been omitted from any buildable lot size in such subdivision,
- 5 pursuant to any zoning ordinance or by-law of the city or town, such real property shall be
- 6 assessed, valued and classified at a value equal to an unimproved, unbuildable lot of real
- 7 property.
- 8 No collector of taxes, constable, sheriff or deputy sheriff, receiving a tax list and warrant
- 9 from the assessors shall collect the taxes for such real property until such time as any parcel of
- real property has been classified pursuant to this section.

- SECTION 2. Chapter 184 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following section:-
- Section 36. No association of homeowners, either incorporated or unincorporated, shall require any homeowner whose real property is contained within the geographical area of the association's jurisdiction to be a member of such association.
