An Act relative to falsely assuming to be a public official.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 33 of chapter 268 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 11 and 12, the words “ a fine of not  
3   more than four hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than one year” and inserting in  
4   place thereof the following words:- a fine of not more than \$5,000 or by imprisonment in a jail or  
5   house of correction for not more than 2 ½ years or by both such fine and imprisonment.
