The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act regarding fair business practices in the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 29F of chapter 29 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after section (i), the following section:-

3 (j) Any employer, contractor or subcontractor, or any officer or agent thereof who has
4 been debarred under this section, who contracts or otherwise secures or participates in contract
5 from which they are barred shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250,000 or by
6 imprisonment for not more than one year for a first offense, or by both such fine and
7 imprisonment; for a subsequent willful offense, a fine of not more than \$500,000, or by
8 imprisonment for not more than two years, or by both such fine and such imprisonment.

9 SECTION 2. Section 25C of chapter 152 of the General Laws, as so appearing, is hereby
10 amended by inserting, in line 144, after the words "section fourteen" the following paragraph:-

11 (a) Any employer, contractor or subcontractor, or any officer or agent thereof who has
12 been debarred under this section, who contracts or otherwise secures or participates in contract
13 from which they are barred shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250,000 or by
14 imprisonment for not more than one year for a first offense, or by both such fine and
15 imprisonment and for a subsequent willful offense a fine of not more than \$500,000, or by
16 imprisonment for not more than two years, or by both such fine and such imprisonment.

17 SECTION 3. Section 27C of Chapter 149, as so appearing, is hereby amended by
18 inserting, in line 53, after the words "in violation of this paragraph" the following new section:-

19 (4) Any employer, contractor or subcontractor, or any officer or agent thereof who has
20 been debarred for violating any provision of section 26, 27, 27A, 27B, 27F, 27G, 27H, who
21 contracts or otherwise secures or participates in any contract from which they are barred shall be
22 punished by a fine of not more than \$250,000 or by imprisonment for not more than one year for
23 a first offense, or by a fine and imprisonment and for a subsequent willful offense a fine of not
24 more than \$500,000, or by imprisonment for not more than two years, or by both such fine and
25 such imprisonment.
