An Act relative to emergency and disaster planning for health care providers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1           SECTION 1: Section 12B of Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new paragraph:
- 3           No health care provider, as defined in section 1 of Chapter 111 or a health care provider  
4   licensed under Chapter 112 of the General Laws, shall be further liable in a suit for damages or  
5   administrative sanctions as a result of good-faith acts or omissions while engaged in the  
6   performance of their duties in rendering emergency care, treatment, advice, or assistance during  
7   a statewide or regional emergency, pandemic, or disaster.
