Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 172 of Chapter 6 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2010
- 2 Official Edition is hereby amended by inserting the following after the word "duties", in line
- 3 149, the following:- "which duties for a police department shall include the screening of
- 4 applications of individuals for paid or volunteer positions with such department"
