An Act relative to fully inform juries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 234 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 34(c), the following section:-

3 Section 34d. In all criminal proceedings, the court shall permit the defendant to inform  
4 the jury of its right to judge the facts and the application of the law in relation to the facts by  
5 providing a specific nullification instruction to the jury. The instruction shall further inform  
6 jurors of their right to refuse to enforce unjust or unjustly applied laws.
