In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

- 1 Section 24 of chapter 68 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by inserting after the first sentence the following sentence:- No person who
- 3 has been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude shall act as a professional
- 4 solicitor at any time.
