An Act relative to the protection of persons with disabilities.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Chapter 265 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby  
2 amended by inserting after section 22C, the following new section:

3           Section 22D. Whoever has sexual intercourse or unnatural sexual intercourse with a  
4 person with disability, as defined in section 13K, and compels such a person with disability to  
5 submit by force and against his or her will or compels such a person with disability to submit by  
6 threat of bodily injury, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for life or for any  
7 terms of years. A prosecution commenced under this section shall neither be continued without a  
8 finding nor placed on file.
