An Act An act relative to adjusting the credit for nonpayment of fines.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1           SECTION 1. Section 144 of the chapter 127 of the General Laws, as appearing in the  
2   2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the word “thirty” and inserting in place  
3   thereof the word:- sixty
