In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to establish the Massachusetts Prisoner Bone Marrow Donation Program.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Notwithstanding and law to the contrary, the following act Massachusetts Prisoner Bone 2 Marrow Donation Program 3 Section 1. There shall be established a bone marrow donation program within the
- Department of Correction. Accepted and eligible prisoners will be able to gain up to a sixty day

reduction in the length of their sentence for an amount of bone marrow donated to be determined

- 6 by the Bone Marrow Donation Committee. Said committee shall be made of the following:
- 7 (a) The Medical Director of the Department of Corrections

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- 8 (b) A Bone Marrow Specialist from a Commonwealth hospital;
- 9 (c) A Representative of an organization advocating for bone marrow donations;
- 10 Said committee shall be responsible for the effective implementation and ongoing

amounts of bone marrow donated, and the estimated life-savings associated with said donations,
to be filed with the Executive and Legislative branches of the Commonwealth. All costs
associated with the Bone Marrow Donation Program will be done by the benefiting institutions
of the program, and their affiliates-not by the Department of Correction. There will be no
commissions or monetary payments to be made to the Department of Correction for bone

marrow donated by inmates.

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
