### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act affecting landlords' rights regarding medical marijuana.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any law or special law to the contrary, residential and
- 2 commercial landlords may regulate smoking of marijuana used for medicinal purposes on or in
- 3 property that such landlord owns or controls. Prohibition of the use of or smoking marijuana,
- 4 including medical use of marijuana on rental property, shall not be deemed to be discrimination
- 5 due to a medical condition under the laws of the commonwealth.
- 6 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
