An Act improving vocational training opportunities for unemployed workers.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 30(c) of chapter 151A of the General Laws, as appearing in the  
2   2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 41 and 68, the word “fifteenth”  
3   and inserting in place thereof the following word:-

4           twentieth.

5           SECTION 2. Section 30(c) of chapter 151A, as so appearing, is hereby further amended  
6   by striking out, in line 43, the number “15” and inserting in place thereof the following number:-

7           20.

8           SECTION 3. Section 30(c) is hereby further amended by inserting, in line 43, after the  
9   word “tolled,” the following words:-
