An Act relative to employer retirement contribution tranches.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 181 the following section:-

3 Section 181A. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 181, or any other law to the
4 contrary, no person, firm, corporation or other entity providing a matching contribution or annual
5 addition to a 401(k) plan shall make such payment in a single lump sum in any taxable year on
6 behalf of or to an employee. For the purposes of this section “401(k) plan” means a traditional
7 401(k), a safe harbor 401(k), a SIMPLE 401(k) or an automatic enrollment 401(k) created
8 pursuant to 26 U.S.C. section 401(k). Any matching contribution or annual addition by an
9 employer to an employee 401(k) plan shall made at the regular pay period for such employee’s
10 wages or compensation.
