# The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to prescription recycling.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
2	is hereby amended by striking out section 25I, and inserting in place thereof the following
3	section:- Section 25I. The department, in conjunction with the board of registration in pharmacy
4	and the division of medical assistance, shall establish and implement methods to reduce
5	medication waste in facilities licensed by the departments of public health, mental health and
6	corrections. The department shall establish such methods, based on its review, that are
7	determined to be effective in reducing waste without imposing unreasonable costs on the health
8	care delivery system. Such methods may be based on, but not be limited to, the following: (1)
9	current technology, standards and reimbursement mechanisms for dispensing and distributing
10	medications to facilities; (2) other states' requirements for limiting prescription drug waste and
11	any cost savings realized; (3) the commonwealth's standards for the return and re-dispensing of
12	patient-specific schedule VI prescription drugs; and (4) possible incentive mechanisms to

prevent the creation of prescription drug waste. The department shall promulgate regulations toimplement this section.'

15 SECTION 2. Section 70E of said chapter 111, as so appearing, is hereby amended by 16 inserting after subsection (o), the following subsection:- (p) to obtain from the facility in charge 17 of the patient's care, upon discharge, any bulk medications that were prescribed for the patient 18 during the patient's stay including, but not limited to, aerosol inhalers, topical products such as 19 creams and powders eye drops, insulins and special order items, provided that any such items are 20 patient specific and personal and would not otherwise be used in the treatment of another patient. 21 Upon discharge from the hospital, these bulk items shall be considered the personal property of 22 the patient and at the prescribing physician's discretion may include in discharge orders that the 23 patient be provided with the specific bulk products that were used in the hospital with use 24 directions. The department shall promulgate regulations to implement this section.

25 SECTION 3. The department of public health, in consultation with the board of 26 registration in pharmacy shall, as shall provide to the joint committee on health care financing 27 and the joint committee on public health, on or before April 1, 2016 a report and legislative 28 recommendations relative to issues of implementation of the programs established under 29 subsection p of section 70E of chapter 111 and section 25I of chapter 111, including, but not 30 limited to: savings and costs related to the implementation of the programs established and 31 recommendations related to penalties for violations of subsection (p) of section 70E of chapter 32 111 and section 25I of chapter 111.

33 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department
34 of public health, in consultation with the department of environmental protection, shall make an

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35 investigation and study regarding the issue of pharmaceutical drug waste and its effect on the 36 environment in the Commonwealth. The department shall report on the following: (1) the 37 estimated quantity of pharmaceutical drug waste in the Commonwealth; (2) the quantity of such 38 waste that may be recovered prior to disposal; (3) the methods and techniques used in other 39 states or local governments to reduce the amount of pharmaceutical drug waste, and identify 40 model programs used to recover or recycle such waste; and (4) the efforts of pharmaceutical drug 41 industry to mitigate waste through consumer support or take-back programs. The department 42 shall make recommendations, consistent with its report, regarding: (1) the feasibility of 43 expanding a drug recycling program similar to that prescribed in section 25I of chapter 111 to all 44 consumers; (2) the feasibility of adopting similar programs adopted by other states or local 45 governments to reduce drug waste; and (3) the feasibility of the department assisting municipal 46 governments to establish local programs to reduce such waste. The department shall make its 47 report and recommendations together with legislation to implement those recommendations by 48 filing the same with the clerks of the senate and house not later than July 31, 2016.
