An Act requiring identification of food allergens in eating establishments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 48E the  
2 following section:-

3           Section 48F. All establishments which serve food will be required to identify in English  
4 the presence of ingredients that contain protein derived from milk, eggs, fish, crustacean  
5 shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, or soybeans in the list of ingredients or to say “contains”  
6 followed by the name of the source of the food allergen after or adjacent to the list of food  
7 products offered. Said list shall be listed on menus or separate food allergen list readily available  
8 to patrons and employees or posted in a location easily viewable by all patrons and employees.  
9 Food allergen list requirements may be modified by direction of the department of public health.
