By Messrs. Frost of Auburn and Zlotnik of Gardner, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1950) of Paul K. Frost, Jonathan D. Zlotnik and Kimberly N. Ferguson for legislation to prohibit local boards of health from banning the sale of consumer products sold legally in the Commonwealth. Public Health.

**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to local Boards of Health and the sale of legal consumer products in the Commonwealth.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Boards of Health in cities and  
2 towns shall not have the power to ban the community-wide sale of any legal consumer product  
3 by authorized stores, establishments and any other entities legally allowed to sell such products  
4 in the Commonwealth and within the existing by-laws of the community, wholesale or retail,  
5 without receiving the approval of town meeting or city council to create such a by-law within the  
6 city or town. This provision shall not interfere with a Board of Health’s ability to take action for  
7 an emergency and immediate health concern for a specific consumer product or from a specific  
8 location if a health code violation has otherwise occurred or some other emergency health issue  
9 should arise so long as such action is not to ban the legal sale for the sake of doing so.
