By Mr. McMurtry of Dedham, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2021) of Paul McMurtry and others for legislation to further regulate the sale of tobacco products to teenagers. Public Health.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act further regulating the sale of tobacco products to teenagers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
2 307C, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, and inserting in place thereof the following
3 section:-

4 Section 307C. The department of public health may, in consultation with the attorney
5 general and the department of revenue, establish regulations for persons engaged in the sale or
6 shipment of a tobacco product, as defined in section 6 of chapter 270, to prevent the sale or
7 delivery of a tobacco product to persons under 21 years of age in the commonwealth.

8 SECTION 2. Chapter 270 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
9 6, as so appearing, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

10 Section 6. (a) As used in this section, the term, “tobacco product” shall mean any product
11 containing, made, or derived from tobacco or nicotine that is intended for human consumption,
12 whether smoked, chewed, absorbed, dissolved, inhaled, snorted, sniffed or ingested by any other

13 means, including, but not limited to: cigarettes, cigars, little cigars, chewing tobacco, pipe
14 tobacco, snuff, or electronic cigarettes, electronic cigars, electronic pipes or other similar
15 products that rely on vaporization or aerosolization. "Tobacco product" shall include any
16 component, part or accessory of a tobacco product. "Tobacco product" shall not include any
17 product that has been approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for sale as a
18 tobacco cessation product and is being marketed and sold solely for the approved purpose.

19 (b) Whoever sells a tobacco product to any person under the age of 21 or, not being his or
20 her parent or guardian, gives a tobacco product to any person under the age of 21 shall be
21 punished by a fine of not less than \$100 for the first offense, not less than \$200 for a second
22 offense and not less than \$300 for any third or subsequent offense.
