In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)

An Act promoting radon testing.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the
2 department of public health shall promulgate regulations to require that, subject to appropriation,
3 all child care programs, as licensed or authorized by the department of early education and care,
4 and public schools undergo routine radon testing. Testing schedules, documentation of testing,
5 standards for acceptable radon levels and plans for mitigation of unacceptable levels of radon
6 shall be determined, and made public, by the department of public health within 1 year of the
7 enactment of this bill.
